Prefix: "in/im-" means in, on, into

Inspect- look in

Inhabit- to live in a place

Import- to bring in goods from another country

Imprison- put someone in prison

Input- adding or putting something into a group



Prefix: "com/col-" means with or together

Collide- slide together

Collect- to gather objects together

Combine- to put things together

Compete- to play with others at a game or sport

Compress- to press together

Prefix: "de-" means down, off of

Defrost- to take frost off of

Declaw- to take the claws off

Depress- press down

Deflate- to take air out of

Descend- climb down
